Villa del Parco

The villa used to belong to the Torrigiani family that descends from the ancient Florentine family from Lamporecchio, whose buildings can be found in several parts of Tuscany. Rebuilt at the beginning of last century after a fire had destroyed it, the villa was added with a magnificent park designed by the most famous landscape gardener of the time...

The Villa is provided with an outdoor swimming pool, tennis court - also suitable for playing volleyball and five-a-side football, bowling green, indoor swimming pool, solarium.

The beauty of the park is enhanced by several furnishing elements and by a large terrace overlooking the valley of the river Arno with a view which encompasses the area between San Gimignano and Lucca, including Vinci, Volterra, San Miniato, Fucecchio, Cerreto Guidi and Livorno.

Thanks to its central position, within easy reach of the region's main areas of interest, Villa del Parco is the ideal place from which to discover the beauty and treasures of Tuscany.

GIAN LUCA LASTRAIOLI

Gian Luca Lastraioli studied Lute at the Conservatorio di Musica F.E. Dall'Abaco in Verona and Musicology at the University of Bologna. Since starting his professional career as lutenist and theorbist in 1982, he has participated in concerts and early music festivals in Italy, France, Denmark, Germany, Norway, Belgium, Switzerland, Holland, Czechoslovakia, Poland, Israel, Great Britain, New Zealand, and Brasil. During his career Gian Luca Lastraioli has played in prestigious venues such as La Scala of Milan, the Concertgebouw of Amsterdam, and the Teatro della Pergola of Florence, joining or conducting well known ensembles specialized in the performance of the Renaissance and Baroque repertoire such as The Harp Consort, Modo Antiquo, Pro Cantione Antiqua, and many more. Gian Luca Lastraioli has recorded over fiffty CD's with the most important European recording labels. He has focused on the study and the performance of Italian Renaissance repertoire for lute and voice, always obtaining brilliant responses from the most varied audiences and constantly receiving outstanding press rewievs. The CD II libro di canto e liuto di Cosimo Bottegari Fiorentino released in 2001 has been described by the specialized press as a "real theatre of emotions". Gian Luca Lastraioli is professor of Lute at the Conservatory of Music A. Scontrino (Trapani) and professor of Music History at Studio Art Centers (Florence). He is artistic director and conductor of Cappella di Santa Maria degli Angiolini and conductor of the European Lute Orchestra.

GIORGIO MATTEOLI

Giorgio Matteoli, orchestra conductor, baroque cello and solo recorder player, is the founder of the baroque italian ensemble Festa Rustica (Fete Rustique) which plays on original instruments. Since 1994 Matteoli with his ensemble FESTA RUSTICA has discovered, recorded and performed on original instruments all over Italy and Europe unknown beautiful music from the 17th and 18th Century. His first recording as soloist and conductor (Mancini: recorder concertos) was awarded by fanfare Magazine as one of the best recording all over the world for 1995 (See Fanfare "The want list 1995). Giorgio Matteoli has recently recorded for the well known Amadeus music Magazine music composed by the venetian Priest Francesco Antonio Vallotti (contemporary of Vivaldi): "Lamentazioni per gli uffici delle Tenebre" for solo singers, obbligato cello, strings and basso continuo. JUAN MANUEL QUINTANA

Buenos Aires-born Juan Manuel Quintana started studying viola da gamba in his hometown with Ricardo Massun. He pursued further studies in Geneva with Arianne Maurette, in Basel (Schola Cantorum) with Paolo Pandolfo and, finally, at the Paris Conservatoire with Christophe Coin. He has appeared in Europe, the United States, Latin America and Japan as a soloist and with celebrated ensembles such as: Les Musiciens du Louvre, Concerto Vocale, Hespèrion XXI and the Ensemble Vocal de Lausanne. An active recording artist, Quintana's Bach, Buxtehude and Marais albums have been hailed by the specialized press. He gained experience in opera productions assisting Mark Minkowski from 1995 to 2005. Since then, he was invited to conduct concerts in Europe, South East Asia and in South America. He led performances of Monteverdi's three operas and Händel's Rodelinda in Argentina and Chile.

PATRIZIA VACCARI

Patrizia Vaccari earned diplomas in piano, organ, organ composition and voice at the Conservatories of Venice and Rovigo. She subsequently furthered her studies in both organ and vocal interpretation, with a particular focus on the repertoires of the renaissance and baroque periods. She has appeared in prestigious concert series as well as in operas and oratorios, collaborating with such important vocal and instrumental ensembles as "Cappella Artemisia" (dir. C.Smith), "Harmonices Mundi" (dir. C. Astronio), "La Capella Reial de Catalunia" (dir. J.Savall), the Ensemble "Cantar Iontano" (dir. M. Mencoboni), the "Venice Baroque Orchestra"

(dir.A.Marcon) , "La Venexiana" (dir.C: Cavina), "Modo Antiquo" (dir.F.Sardelli), "Abendmusik" (dir. John Finney). For the chamber music, she collaborates with the pianist Carlo Mazzoli and with Ensemble Musagète (dir. G.Guglielmo). She has recorded for the labels "Tactus", "Rivo Alto", "Naxos", "Simphonia" and "Chandos", and has recorded the cantatas op. 4 for soprano and basso continuo by Tomaso Albinoni and "S.Giovanni Battista" by A.Stradella with the ensemble "Harmonices Mundi" for the label "Stradivarius". As part of the experimental program for early music in Italian conservatories, Patrizia is professor of Renaissance and Baroque Singing at the "A. Pedrollo" Conservatory of Vicenza. Moreover, she teached in the International Courses of Early Music in Belluno, Pamparato (Cuneo), Nervi (Genova), Bolzano, Monte S.Savino (Arezzo), Corinaldo (Ancona) and at the "Scuola Civica" in Milano.
